

Candidats.fr is an initiative led by April, the main Free Software advocacy organization in France.

It aims at educating the election candidates in France to issues related to Free Software and digital freedom, and get them to commit to action.

It provides resources and tools for citizens and organisations to participate in that effort.

Presidential elections <i>April 2007</i> 12 candidates	 34 questions were sent to the candidates. Issues like usage of Free Software in public administrations, open standards, DRM, interoperability, software patents Documentation was sent along on all those topics (the real objective of the campaign) Gentle political pressure applied;)
8 answered !	 8 out of 12 candidates answered, including the 5 top scores.
Parliamentary elections	 A short "Pact of Free Software" was written.
June 2007	 The pact contains acknowledgement of the nature of Free Software and commitment to take action to protect and encourage it.
6,000+ candidates	A collaborative platform was built to allow
577 seats	volunteers all around France to register their
600+ volunteers	candidates and have them sign the Pact.Precise documentation was made available.
69 MPs signed the Pact !	 521 candidates, out of which 69 got elected, signed the Pact.
Local elections	 Adaptation of the Pact for local elections.
(mayors and district councils)	 Commitment to use Free Software and Open Standards in all local administrations, and to
March 2008	inform the general public.
